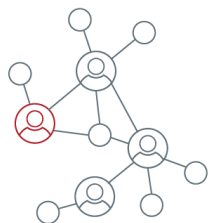

HOW TO GET AWAY WITH MURDER: Misdiagnosed Homicides & Asphyxiation Crimes

Asphyxiation, including drowning, strangulation, and suffocation, is a leading cause of death and a preferred method among serial killers, serial predators, and other offenders. Without obvious sign of external trauma, homicides resulting from asphyxiation are often missed or misdiagnosed as suicides, accidents, and natural deaths. This presentation will address the dynamics of asphyxiation crimes, crime scene staging, processing scenes, and interpreting "undetermined" causes of death in an autopsy. Attendees will learn how to investigate cases with undetermined causes of death and, most importantly, will learn how to recognize, investigate, and document asphyxiation homicides.
